1. Abbot, Will—Wood cutter; embark'd 14 Oct. 1735; arrived Feb. 1735-6; lot 8N. in Frederica. Appointed 2nd constable of Frederica in case of vacancy, 26 Sept. 1735.
2. Abraham, Eliz.—Widow; servt. to Peter Gordon; embark'd 31 Oct. 1734; arrived 2 Dec. 1734.
3. Adde, Solomon—Age 30; shoemaker; Palatin; embark'd July 1738; arrived 7 Oct. 1738. Adde and his family carry'd over by Capt. Thompson at his own risk, but Col. Oglethorpe charged the Trustees with their passage (which they disapproved) and gave them to the Saltburgers.
4. —, Margaret, w.—Age 32; embark'd July 1738; arrived 7 Oct. 1738.
5. —, John, son—Age 3; embark'd July 1738; arrived 7 Oct. 1738.
6. Addison, Edwd.—Miller; embark'd 14 Oct. 1735; arrived Feb. 1735-6; lot 15N. in Frederica. Third Bailif of Frederica—removed abt. 1739. Went to settle with his family in Carolina Dec. 1740. Quitted Dec. 1740.
7. —, Mary, w.—Went with her husband to Carolina Dec., 1740.
8. —, Edwd., son—Went with his father to Carolina Dec., 1740.
9. —, Mary, d.—Quitted Dec., 1740.
10. Aigel [or Argel] Geo.—Age 40; husbandman, Saltsburgr.; embark'd 22 Sept. 1741; arrived 2 Dec. 1741.
11. —, Ursula, w.—Age 41.
12. —, Anna Maria, d.—Age 6.
13. —, Anna Teresa, d.—Age 10.
14. —, Jo. Franz, son—Age 3.

18. Allen, John—Servt. to Hen. Fletcher; embark'd 4 April, 1733; arrived 21 July, 1733.
19. Allen, Will—Baker; embark'd 14 Oct. 1735; arrived Feb. 1735-6; lot 6S. in Frederica. Appointed Tithing man of Frederica 26 Sept. 1735; quitted May 1741 and went to Carolina. Quitted May 1741.
20. —, Eliz., w.—Quitted May 1741.
21. Amatis, Nics.—Italian silk man; embark'd 4 April 1733; arrived 21 July 1733. Brother to Paul; brought from Piedmont for the same purpose, but proved an idle troublesome fellow and quitted the Colony. In Aug. 1735 his brother discharged him. Quitted Aug. 1735.
22. —, Paul—Italian silk man—embark'd 6 Nov. 1732; arrived 1 Feb.

- May 1733; Lot 46 in Savannah; dead.
730. —, Robt.—Age 17; servt. to Tho. Christie; 6 Nov. 1732; arrived 1 Feb. 1732-3; Lot 13 in Savannah. He marry'd Anne d. of Geo. Syms. His lot was granted him 21 Dec. 1733, and is supposed vacant. Dead 23 July 1734.
731. Jolliffe, Mary—Age 22; single woman; Scotch; embark'd 21 Sept. 1741; arrived 4 Dec. 1741.
732. Jones, Cornelius—Apprentice to Saml. Grey; embark'd Nov. 1732; arrived 1 Feb. 1732-3. Discharged by his master.
733. —, John—Servt. to Josephy Smith; embark'd 29 Oct. 1734; arrived 28 Dec. 1734. He past from the service of Jos. Smith to that of Ja. Calloway.
734. —, Mary—Age 17; Servt. for 4 yrs. to Wid. Vandeplank; embarked 19 Nov. 1737; arrived 14 Jan. 1737-8. Hired & carry'd at Capt. Thompson the owners risk, but the Planters not being able to pay such servants, Mr. Causton without order took them and certified the same which made the Trustees lyable to pay.
735. Jones, Noble—Age 32; carpenter; embark'd 6 Nov. 1732; arrived 1 Feb. 1732-3; lot 41 in Savannah. Employ'd to survey the peoples lots, but removed for negligence. He took possession of this lot 21 Dec. 1733 and afterwards improved land at some distance from the town. He was I think a constable also, and officer for executing the Rum Act. He now resides mostly at his new plantation aht. 10 miles from Savannah. On 21 Oct. 1738 Mr. Oglethorp removed him from being surveyor and first Constable, but afterwards gave him the comand of the Narrows. In the Colony the end of the year 1746.
736. —, Sarah, w.—Age 32; in the Colony the end of the year 1746.
737. —, Mary, d.—Age 3; in the Colony the end of the year 1746.
738. —, Noble, son—Age 10; lot 46 in Savannah; in the Colony the end of the year 1746.
739. Jones, Thomas — Embark'd May 1738. Formerly High Constable of St. Gyles. Appointed storekeeper in Mr. Caustons place, & gave 1000£ Security.
740. Joubert, Pet.—Broker; embark'd 6 Aug. 1735; arrived 27 Nov. 1735; lot 231 in Savannah. An idle fellow, & on shutting up the Publick stores deserted the Colony none knows where. On 16 Jan. 1735-6 he had leave to dispose of his Townlot, and take a country one of 150 acres, but I can't find when a grant was made him. In July 1738 he was an inmate in Savannah on lot 232. Quitted Jan. 1738-9; returned.
741. —, Mary, w.
742. Joyce, Paul—Dyer; embark'd 28 Sept. 1733; arrived 14 Jan. 1733-4. Settled at Skidaway. Dead 12 Feb. 1733-4.
743. Juker [or Iuker] Hans Adam—Age 45; farmer; Swiss; embark'd 21 Sept. 1741; arrived 4 Dec. 1741; dead soon after landing.
744. —, Barbara, w.
745. Kalcher, Ruprecht — Husbandman; embark'd 31 Oct. 1734; arrived 28 Dec. 1734; Saltsburger, settled at Ebenezar; living 13 March 1738-9.
746. —, Margt., w. Saltsburger, settled at Ebenezar; living 13 March 1738-9.
747. Kaudnoor, Lawrence—Age 58; weaver; Palatin Tr. servt.; arrived 20 Dec. 1737.
748. —, Barbara, w.—Age 57.

1106. Papot, James—Carpenter; embark'd June 15, 1733; arrived 29 Aug. 1733; lot 120 in Savannah. He took to his 2d wife Jane Robe 10 Jan. 1734-5. In 1736 he only fell'd & clear'd 1 acre, since neglected.
1107. —, Mary, w.—Dead 14 Oct. 1733.
1108. Papot, Jeremy—Vine dresser; embark'd 15 June 1733; arrived 29 Aug. 1733; dead 23 Oct. 1733.
1109. —, Magdalene, w.—Embark'd 11 Sept. 1733; arrived 16 Dec. 1733. Re-marry'd to Jo. Fontain 31 Jan. 1734-5. Run away 1737.
1110. —, Jane, d.
1111. —, Susan, d.
1112. Parker, Edwd.—Brother of Robt.; embark'd 11 Sept. 1733; arrived 16 Dec. 1733.
1113. Parker, Hen.—Linnen draper; embark'd 15 June 1733; arrived 29 Aug. 1733; lot 111 in Savannah. Made 3d. Bailif 1734, and 2d Bailif 1736. Lastly appointed 1st Bailif in Mr. Caustons room June 1738, but removed 20 June 1739, for drunkenness, debasing the character of a magistrate, and countenancing the insolent application made to the Trustees for introducing Negroes & changing the Tenure of lands. He took land some miles up in the country, but has yet no grant of it. He lives inmate on the Wid. Coopers lot No. 20. But she complains he pays her no rent. 25 March 1740 he was restored to his office of 1. Bailif, having left of drinking.

1119. Parker, Robt., junr.—Brother of Edwd.; embark'd 11 Sept. 1733; arrived 16 Dec. 1733; lot 20N. in Frederica. In 1734 he was concern'd in the design'd insurrection. In Nov. 27, 1736 convicted of beating his servant to make her give a false certificate of her demand of wages. Marry'd the widow Sale 30 Sept. 1734. Run away.
1120. Parker, Saml.—Age 33; heel maker; embark'd 6 Nov. 1732; arrived 1 Feb. 1732-3; lot 38 in Savannah. He lived not to take up his lot, which was possess'd by his widow. He went over 2. Constable of Savannah. Dead 20 July 1733.
1121. —, Jane, w.—Age 36. She took possession of the lot intended her husband 21 Dec. 1733. Re-marry'd to Saml. Mercer 6 May 1734. Dead 9 Aug. 1742.
1122. —, Saml., s.—Age 16; smith; lot 93 in Savannah. He went to Carolina to seek for work, but return'd, and in July 1740 work'd at the orphan house. Dead 1741.
1123. —, [ ? ], wife—Dead Aug. 1742.
1124. Parker, Tho.—Brother; age 9.
1125. Parker, Will.—Silversmith; embark'd 15 June 1733; arrived 29 Aug. 1733; lot 114 in Savannah. Brother of Henry, reported to be a Papist. He neglects his own lot and rents his br. Henry's.
1126. Parnel, Danl.—Brazier; embark'd 20 Oct. 1735; arrived Feb. 1735-6; lot 20N. in Frederica. Quitted Jan. 1738-9.
1127. Pater, Anne Maria—Servt. to Pet. Morell; embark'd 28 Sept. 1733; arrived 14 Jan. 1733-4.

1. Aberdaun, Heyman—Jew inmate; arrived 10 July 1733. Fyn'd for scandal 0.13.4, 27 Sept. 1734. Inmate at Savannah. Fled the Colony with his wife & 2 small children for fear of the Spaniards 29 July 1740. Run away May 28, 1740 [sic].
2. —, Abigail, w.—Jew. Run away 28 May 1740.
3. —, Solomon, s.—Jew. Run away 28 May 1740.
4. Aberdaun, Simon, *als.*, Bandenoon—Jew inmate; arrived 10 July 1733. Fyn'd for defamation £ 3.3.0, 27 Sept. 1734. Inmate at Savannah.
5. —, Grace, w.—Jew.
6. Adams, Benj.—Lot 222 in Savannah. He became possess of this lot in April 1737, but neglects it & rents lot 78. A riotour in open court 20 Oct 1737. Run away.
7. Adams, Jo.
8. Addison, Eliz.—D. of Edward, Senr.; born in Georgia. Her father Edwd. Addison Senr. carry'd her to Carolina Dec. 1740. Quitted Dec. 1740.
9. Adriche, [ ? ]—Servt. to Isaac Camuche. She was at first servt. to Ri. Warren.
10. Agerner, Hariet—Servt. to Ja. Bailou.
11. Aglionby, Will., Esq.—Attorney; lot 109 in Savannah. On 2d. June 1736 100 acres was granted him 2 June 1736 but he chose to dwell in Savannah and make mischief there. His lot in that town was order'd to be run out 4 May 1737. As he lived so he died a profest Deist. Lot vacant Feb. 1738-9. Dead 23 Aug. 1738.
12. Alban, Mary—Servt.; arrived 15 Mar. 1733-4.
13. Alfingston, Will.—Arrived 14 Jan. 1733-4. He was settled at Skidaway; dead 27 Jan. 1733-4.
14. —, Anne, w.—Remarry'd to Ambrose Morrison, and remov'd from Skidaway to Savannah. She mar. Morrison 20 Mar. 1733-4. Dead 26 June 1737.
15. Alston, Joseph—Servt.; arrived 4 June 1737.
16. Amatis, Cath.—W. of Paul Amatis. Re-marry'd to Tho. Neale April 1737 and settled with him in Carolina. Quitted. Dead 1739.
17. Amory, John—Embark'd 19 Nov. 1737; arrived 14 Jan. 1737-8. He had a grant of 150 acres made him 5 Oct. 1737. He understands surveying. He went to Charlestown Nov. 1738 he had credit from the Trust for 50£,

363. England, Will.—Servt. to Fra. Lynch; arrived 27 Nov. 1733. Servt. first to Fra. Lynch, afterwards to John Amory.
364. Escobee, Sarah—Servt. to Fra. Lynch; arrived 27 Nov. 1733. At first servt. to Fra. Lynch, then transfer'd to Nuner Henriques, & lastly servt. to Isaac King Clark.
365. Evans, Andrew—Servt.; embark'd 30 Sept. 1733; arrived 16 Dec. 1733; shot himself by accident 26 July 1739.
366. Eyre, Tho.—Lt. in Oglethorpe's Regiment; lot 9N. in Frederica. Agent to the Cherokees.
367. —, [ ? ], w.—D. of Lt. Ed Cook; quitted to England before Aug. 1741.
368. Fage, Lewis—Son of Peter; born in Georgia.
369. —, Fra.—Son of Ditto; born in Georgia 30 June 1734; dead 8 July 1734.
370. —, Peter—Son of Ditto; born in Georgia.
371. Fallowfeild, Jo.—Arrived 15 Feb. 1733-4; lot 136 in Savannah. Fyn'd for defamation four pence 28 July 1735. Naval Officer 3 Feb. 1738/9 & on 30 May 1739 made 3d Bailif of Savanah in Robert Gilberts room. In 1736 he had fully improved 15 acres, from whence he had 95 bushels of Indian corn, 40 of potatoes, & 22 of rice. He let his greatest house, and lived much at a plantation some miles in the country. Succeeded 1st Constable on Noble Jones removal 24 Oct. 1738. Turn'd a violent malecontent 1740. He marryed about March 1734/5 but I know not who. Quitted to Carolina 1742.

373. —, [ ? ], son—Born in Georgia; run away with his father.
374. —, [ ? ], son—Born in Georgia; run away with his father.

377. Fawset, Tho.—Gent.; embark'd 21 Sept. 1733; arrived 12 Jan. 1733-4. He had a grant made him of 500 acres 4 July 1733. Dead 14 July 1735.

379. Ferguson, Tho.—Servt.; arrived 8 June 1737.
380. Ferguson, Will.—Master of the Scout boat.
381. Fernando, Judith—Jew; arrived 10 July 1733. Sister to Abrm. Molina, & lives with him on Lot 69 in Savannah.
382. Fisher, Will.—A minor. An orphan. Has a lot at Hampstead which Michl. Burgholder takes care of.
383. Fitzgerald, Mary—Servt. to Jo. Carwell; arrived 10 Jan. 1733-4.
384. Fitzpatrick, Cath.—Servt. to the Trust. Convicted of a bastard child 26 May 1735.
385. Fletcher, Tho.—Embark'd 4 April 1733; arrived 21 July 1733; lot 98 in Savannah. Qy. if this be the same wch. Hen. Fletcher to whom a grant of 200 acres was past 28 March 1733? Quitted with his family being sick & went to Charlestown.

388. Flin, John—Servt. to Wid. Thibaut; arrived 10 Jan. 1733-4.
